Carpooling to and from the camp will be available. After you register someone will contact you with information about pick-up and drop off.

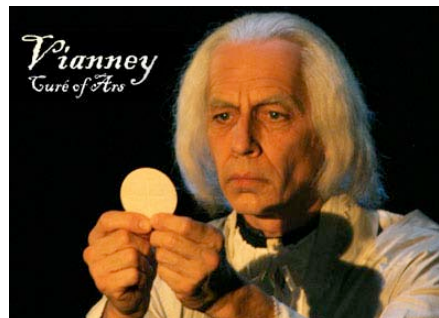
Cost: All costs will be covered by generous donors including the Knights of Columbus and Serra Clubs and other private donations.
